

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## Summer Credit Programs- BBSS

**Credit Recovery** is open to students who have completed a course during the school year or semester, but have not successfully completed the curriculum expectations to a passing level. Students must meet this criteria and be referred to by the Student Success Team. **Program runs from June 25 to July 17, 2018 at Manidoo.**

**Summer CO-OP** credits provide students with the opportunity to catch up on missed credits and gain flexibility in regular course scheduling. It is available to any grade 9-12 students wishing to accumulate credits and work experience. Interested students should already have full time jobs and must complete orientation materials (that can be done at home). **Program runs from June 25 to Aug. 31, 2018 at Manidoo.** The summer CO-OP could consist of:

- 1 credit for a minimum of 110 hours of paid work
- 2 credits for a minimum of 220 hours of paid work

**Connections Courses** enable grade 9-12 students who have not been successful during the regular school year to obtain a credit by repeating the course, or for grade 9-12 students to take a new course. These courses are ideal for students who require nine (9) credits for graduation the upcoming year, or for students whose credit total is less than thirty (30) in the year they intend to graduate. It may also accommodate conflicts where courses are required for college or university entrance requirements, or students who wish to additional courses of interest. **Program runs from June 25 to Aug. 31, 2018 at Manidoo.**

The **Reach-Ahead** program provides an opportunity for grade 8-12 students to supplement and enrich their Secondary Education by acquiring a credit in the summer. Students interested in the Reach-Ahead program require Principal approval. Successful applicants will be contacted by the school.

There will be two course options for grade 8 students:

**Food and Nutrition, Grade 9, Open (HFN10):** This course focuses on guidelines for making nutritious food choices. Students will investigate factors that influence food choices, including beliefs, attitudes, current trends, traditional eating patterns, food-marketing strategies, and individual needs. Students will also explore the environmental impact of a variety of food choices at the local and global level. The course provides students with opportunities to develop food-preparation skills and introduces them to the use of social science research methods in the area of food and nutrition. **Program runs from June 25 to July 10, 2018 at BBSS.**

**Learning Strategies 1: Skills for Success in Secondary School, Grade 9, Open (GLS10):** This course focuses on learning strategies to help students become better, more independent learners. Students will learn how to develop and apply literacy and numeracy skills, personal management skills, and interpersonal and teamwork skills to improve their learning and achievement in school, the workplace, and the community. The course helps students build confidence and motivation to pursue opportunities for success in secondary school and beyond. **Program runs from August 20-31, 2018 at BBSS.**

There will be two course options for grade 9-12 students, which is:

**Civics and Citizenship, grade 10, open (CHV20):** This course explores rights and responsibilities associated with being an active citizen in a democratic society. Students will explore issues of civic importance such as healthy schools, community planning, environmental responsibility, and the influence of social media, while developing their understanding of the role of civic engagement and of political processes in the local, national, and/or global community. Students will apply the concepts of political thinking and the political inquiry process to investigate, and express informed opinions about, a range of political issues and developments that are both of significance in today's world and of personal interest to them. **Program runs from June 25-29, 2018 at BBSS.**

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**Career Studies**, grade 10, open (GLC2O): This course teaches students how to develop and achieve personal goals for future learning, work, and community involvement. Students will assess their interests, skills, and characteristics and investigate current economic and workplace trends, work opportunities, and ways to search for work. The course explores postsecondary learning and career options, prepares students for managing work and life transitions, and helps students focus on their goals through the development of a career plan. **Program runs from July 4-11, 2018 at BBSS.**
