- Students must apply in their final year of school.
- All scholarships and bursaries are conditional upon your acceptance by a post secondary institution. Proof of Registration from the college or university must be submitted prior to receiving any funds. This form is located on the back of your letter of “Congratulations” which is presented to the winners at grad.

All applications **must** be accompanied by a letter outlining your qualifications and suitability for the award, bursary or scholarship. **Please read all instructions carefully!**

*****These awards and bursaries are only available to graduates of Beaver Brae Secondary School.**

- Scholarships and Bursaries may be deferred up to 15 months following graduation, **unless otherwise stipulated, as some organizations do not allow the award to be deferred if you are planning to take a year off**. For those that allow deferral, a **deferral notice must be received at Beaver Brae** by **September 15th** of the same year you graduate or leave school.
- Government programs exist to help students to continue their education. Under the Ontario Student Assistance Program (O.S.A.P.) students can apply for:
 1. Canada Student Loan, and
 2. Provincial Bursary or Grant

No late applications will be accepted. All completed applications must be returned to BBSS Student Services by the date indicated UNLESS a different address is specified in the booklet/application. PLEASE NOTE: Some application deadlines may differ from the above date.

Please do not forget to extend gratitude. **Some funds will be issued from Beaver Brae, some are issued by the organization directly. The return envelope included in your award envelope will reflect where the Confirmation of Registration at post-secondary needs to be sent.**
