Principal's and Vice Principal's Report

Kristen Fregeau:

Settled in to routine, start up completed and students participating in class, extra learning and field trips.

We are short staff and have been having to reassign staff; with some 11/12 classes being assigned independent learning; this isnt our first resort for a solution, if anyone knows anyone looking as qualified or unqualified teachers please send them to Kristen Fregeau, Brooks Meija or Gary Lynch, as well as go to the KPDSB Website to apply.

Interim reports went home last week via email, we will continue this system moving forward for interim and mid term reports. Pam likes the electronic reports.

Caregiver Conference Thursday, October 12, 2023, 4:00 p.m. - 6:30 p.m. half Lib half of the teachers will be in the cafeteria and the other half in library.

Kristen is thinking we should have a sign in to help track numbers, as we haven't had the best turnout in the past. It was shared we have to follow the teachers collective agreement only do so many hours after school and per year for the teachers and they need time to eat prior to Caregiver Conference.

Late start last week; during the late start teachers continued community learning on co creating criteria with students. This PD day October 27, we will spend most day with staff continuing this learning. Collecting more voice and feedback at our School Improvement Plan (SIP)

Gary shared same information from last meeting about his job and working to connect education with students who need, with KCA, 7 Gens, Creighton and Youth Justice

Alt program will be attending the KCA FAll FEASTS. There will also be a Men, Boys and 2 Spirit Retreat Gary will attend with his students.



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IEPS go home tomorrow 30 days from start school and IPRC will be scheduled after the IEPS go out.

We have 2 sets of SERTS - Jerry Via and Deb Allen, with Jennifer Uri coming in as a 3rd SERT in February.

Pam asked what do we do for students who don't have diagnosis, can they have an IEP without diagnosis. Gary touched on this and mentioned that yes they can, and we have system in place working with staff and students to help so students don't fall through the cracks. (Non diagnosis such as trauma, live circumstances, etc.)

Pam mentioned she has used a therapist who does art therapy and other services; maybe we could look at for coming to school, it was shared we have counsellors on staff

Gary mentioned we have supports with Youth Justice, Mahon Mental Health and KCA Trauma, they are in the school and we can also refer students to services.

Finance

Good news school cash zero balance, this is what is required at end of school year.

Current Business

Bronco Clothing next order soon, cost will be going up.

Parking specific accessibility parking, navigating end day pickup, morning is more sporadic, end day is stressful; community businesses have reached out that we are taking up their parking lot.

New parking designated at end tech wing for accessible parking, more parking and more space to move. We may have construction next summer to improve the bus loading and parking lot area behind the school
